1. Introduction

Hi – my name is Frances and I've been working with lots of my friends and children from primary schools all over England, to make this song about palaeontologist <u>Mary Anning</u> which I hope you will learn to sing too, and even write your own verses.



Who Was Mary Anning?

Mary Anning was born in Lyme Regis on the south coast of Dorset in 1799 where she lived all her life in a little house by the sea. When she was only 12 years old she and her brother James found the complete skeleton of an ichthyosaur in the muddy cliffs nearby. Despite hardly any lessons at school she grew up to become a really important palaeontologist who influenced many of the great thinkers of the day and helped to change the way Victorians thought about how old the world was. Alongside her dog, Tray, she found many more extraordinary fossils, and made a special study of coprolites (fossilized poo!). She didn't receive the recognition she deserved and lived a very hard life, but we now remember her as a great female pioneer. What does a palaeontologist do?

Like Mary Anning, modern palaeontologists search for fossils of animals and plants that died out millions of years ago. They often have to work very hard to get them out of the rocks, then they draw or photograph them, study where they were found and work out how they fit in to the long long story of planet earth. Anyone can look for fossils and you can find out more about them on this link from the Natural History Museum in London.

The Song!

The song was made out of the winning entries for our song competition in 2022. The composers were aged from 5-11 years and all had worked hard to find out lots about Mary Anning and why we should remember her.

Now you can learn the song using all the materials we've prepared for you – and there's lots of different ways, including your own! BUT – if you need help, Frances can help you sing it really well if you follow her voice on the Listen & Repeat Sound Recordings. You will find the words and the music too written out for you, and a track with just the accompaniment – oh and don't forget to learn some of the BSL signs with from the video. 









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


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5. Learning Guide

You will have your own ideas about how best to use the materials but these suggestions may help, particularly if you are not confident to lead singing with your group (TIP! - the recordings will do this for you!)

- 1. Watch the YouTube video of the animated film of *A Song for Mary Anning*, and ask pupils to try to remember everything they learn from it about Mary Anning.
- 2. Discuss Mary Anning (you'll find out more about her on this link) see how much of her story everyone can tell. Ask questions about why she was important, see if you can pinpoint her most amazing achievements, and how she was treated while she was alive. There are some suggestions further down about books you can read about her and about palaeontology
- 3. Get everyone on their feet and Play the **Warm Ups** track before every session it has special Mary Anning exercises to develop voices!
- 4. Learn to sing the song really well either use the **LISTEN AND REPEAT** sound files or if you are able to do it yourself you can use the **Music Score** with guitar/piano chords on page 7.
 - NB you can use the **SONG WORDS** (page 5) at this point but consider learning the chorus by rote (with actions!) and assign the verses to different groups/pairs/solos eg:- there are 4 Verses and an Intro that could be assigned. Each group would remember their verse only and use actions, ideally from the BSL video (but they can make up their own too!), to lead the rest of the group and all would join in the chorus of course!
- 5. Watch the **BSL VIDEO** and join in with the signing you can follow Frances if you are not used to doing this or our BSL Interpreter if you are!
- 6. When you are ready, sing along with **THE COMPLETE SONG** track
- 7. Once they are familiar with the song they may like to try it without me! So use the **ACCOMPANIMENT ONLY** or play it on guitar or keyboard and see how you get on.


GO FURTHER!


